

# Moses (with God and through His power) "Opened the Sea"

- **Biblical Foundation:** Exodus 14, Luke 1:37, Romans 3:23, 1 Corinthians 10:13, Luke 1:37, Deuteronomy 31:6, Matthew 28:20, Luke 1:37.
- Topic or main lesson: "In God We Find the Power to Overcome."
- Story: Moses and the Red Sea.
- Objectives

That the children may:

- Learn that with God we have the power to overcome.
- Feel the desire to ask God to help us to overcome difficulties.
- Take the decision of trusting in the help that God can give us.
- Memory Verse: "For with God nothing shall be impossible." Luke 1:37.
- Song: "See the Miracle."
- Introduction

Have you ever seen a river? Did you cross it? Have you ever seen the ocean? It's hard to cross. How can we cross it? By swimming? It's almost possible. Maybe on a boat? That is more likely. How about walking? No.

Today we will study the story of a people who crossed the sea. You'll see how they did it.

# Esther "Bravely Saved Her People"

- **Biblical Foundation:** Book of Esther, Jeremiah 29:11, Joshua 1:9, Jeremiah 20:11.
- Topic or main lesson: "God is our help in times of trouble."
- Story: Esther confronts the king to save her people.
- ObjectivesThat the abildren
  - That the children may:
  - Learn that God is with us in the hard times.
  - Be sure that God gives us the courage we need during the hard times.
  - Ask God to help a us to be brave during difficult times.
- Memory Verse: "But the Lord is with me as a mighty terrible one." Jeremiah 20:11 (f. p.).
- Song: "Courageous".
- Introduction

Divide the children into two groups. We will now see if there are any brave children here who dare to measure their strength. Highlight that it's a challenge just for the brave—for those who are courageous. Place the groups against each other to pull a rope and see who has more strength and courage. Tug of War.

- Objectives

#### That the children may:

- Know that with the Lord's help we can overcome fear
- Feel that with the Lord we can overcome.
- Make the decision to ask the Lord for help in overcoming fear.
- **Memory Verse:** "WheneverI am afraid, I will trust in Thee." Psalms 56:3.
- Song: "Five Little Stones."
- Introduction

Bring a slingshot and talk about what it's used for. Bad uses and good uses. Tell them that today we will talk about a boy who used a slingshot for something very special.

Amongst them was David's family.  There were many Philistines, and they had a giant with them that was very scary.  He made fun of Israel, and came out every day to challenge anyone to fight him. All of Israel was dying of fear.	And you?	Have you ever been afraid? We're all afraid: Some of us are afraid of the dark. Others are afraid of older people, of storms, of cockroaches, of mice, etc	People camping in the desert. Philistines and Israelites ready to fight. David's family. Goliath the giant. Suddenly he heard the cries of a giant mocking the Israelites and their God.  But he wasn't afraid, he started asking who was going to face the Giant.	And you?	What are you doing when you are afraid?  Do you run to your mom, do you scream, or do you call everybody? We can do many things (let the children tell their experiences). # Joshua "Destroyed a City by Being Obedient"

- **Biblical Foundation:** Joshua 6, Colossians 3:20, Proverbs 1:8, Ephesians 6:1, John 14:23, Deuteronomy 5:33, Deuteronomy 28:1.
- Story: Joshua destroys Jericho.
- Topic or main lesson: "God wants us to always be obedient".

### ObjectivesThat the children

#### That the children may:

- Understand that we will have many victories if we are obedient.
- Understand that being obedient is the best option.
- Take the decision to be obedient.
- Memory Verse: "And it shall come to pass, if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice of the Lord thy God, to observe and to do all his commandments which I command thee this day, that the Lord thy God will set thee on high above all nations of the earth." Deuteronomy 28:1.
- Song: "Jericho".

#### Introduction

Prepare materials to make a trumpet. Start by producing a sound with the trumpet. In today's story we'll see what the trumpets could do.

And the Lord said unto Joshua, See, I have given into thine hand Jericho, and the king thereof, and the mighty men of valour. Joshua 6:2.	You know what?	All of us are given orders by older people—our parents, teachers, and grandparents. And many times, it's up to us to choose if we will obey or not. And the Lord said unto Joshua, See, I have given into thine hand Jericho, and the king thereof, and the mighty men of valor. And ye shall compass the city, all ye men of war, and go round about the city once. Thus shalt thou do six days. And seven priests shall bear before the ark seven trumpets of rams' horns: and the seventh day ye shall compass the city seven times, and the priests shall blow with the trumpets. And it shall come to pass, that when they make a long blast with the ram's horn, and when ye hear the sound of the trumpet, all the people shall shout with a great shout; and the wall of the city shall fall down flat, and the people shall ascend up every man straight before him. Joshua 6:2-5.  You know what? This was something incredible! Would that city be destroyed by just playing the trumpet?  Would Joshua obey this strange order given by God?	(Amazed facial expression).	We get a lot of orders like: Let the children talk and lead them the right way.  And for example, our teachers tell us: "Do all of your homework." We can say, why so much homework?  Our parents tell us: do the dishes, make your bed, sweep the floor. We can say: why do I have to do it? Let someone else do it!  In Colossians 3:20 the Bible says, Children, obey your parents in all things: for this is well pleasing unto the Lord.  Do we obey the word of God?	War plan to attack Jericho. Joshua did all that God commanded, even to each tiny detail. He called the priests and told them to carry the ark, and then called seven more priests to carry trumpets and march in front of the ark. All the people would also go.  When the instructions ended, the people marched before the ark of the Lord's covenant. The trumpets kept sounding the whole way. The people then marched about the city quietly for six days. After marching around the city once each day, they returned to the camp. The trumpet never stopped sounding. But the city was still standing. Some people didn't believe while others did. But they all obeyed the voice of God.	Just like us.	Many times we are like the Israelites. We receive orders from our parents, or, in the Bible, orders from God. But we don't know if we will obey them or not. If we believe or not. But the Bible says: My son, hear the instruction of thy father, and forsake not the law of thy mother: Proverbs 1:8.  Children, obey your parents in the Lord: for this is right. Ephesians 6:1.  Our parents have already lived a pretty big part of their lives and know what is best for us. We must obey God.  Jesus answered and said unto him, If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him. John 14:23. On the seventh round, the priests played the trumpets, and Joshua commanded the people to start shouting! The Lord has given you the city!  Shouts and screams were heard as the whole city crumbled to the ground.  Victory had come because they were obedient.	What about you?	Are you obedient? Ye shall walk in all the ways which the Lord your God hath commanded you, that ye may live, and that it may be well with you, and that ye may prolong your days in the land which ye shall possess.  Deuteronomy 5:33. We also have a beautiful promise in Deuteronomy 28:1: And it shall come to pass, if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice of the Lord thy God, to observe and to do all his commandments which I command thee this day, that the Lord thy God will set thee on high above all nations of the earth. Is there anything that scares you? Today I will teach you about Peter. He was one of Jesus' disciples.

After Peter was freed, he went to the brethren's house.  Rhoda answered the door and recognized him, but instead of letting him in, she closed the door and ran inside to tell the others.  They don't believe her, thinking that it could be an angel.  Peter keeps knocking and then they go open and see that Peter was truly there and that a miracle had happened.  Peter then went to another city to continue preaching.	(Short Silence).	It is only when we see God's providences in light of eternity, that we will start to understand the debt we owe to the angels that care and intercede for us.
