1. Welcome

Welcome everyone in a friendly, cheerful, and fun way, greeting the children in a group and general way. Present yourself and the other teachers.

2. Musical Moment

Start with joyful songs. Always review the previous songs. Teach them the theme song and the song of the day.

The verse is taught in different ways. Each part of the verse is symbolized by something God created. For example, the shape of a flower, leaf, apple, etc.

Each part of the program must be carried out continuously, without spaces of silence. Review the time of prayer in the instruction manual to know how to do it. Teach what prayer is. Compare prayer as if we were talking to a friend.

Talk about the importance of talking to God every day. Perform a short and simple prayer so that the children can learn by example.

Each part of the program must be carried out continuously, without spaces of silence. Review the time of prayer in the instruction manual to know how to do it.

Teach different examples of what prayer is. E.x.: Telephone, traffic light. Illustrate the phone, and traffic light on large paper poster so that the children can easily remember. You illustrate an image of children praying.

Talk about the importance of talking to God every day. Perform a short and simple prayer so that the students will learn by example.

Orange, because it's not time yet.


Green, when he answers positively.
