- There are hundreds of religious groups and thousands of sects. Each group claims
 to possess the truth, and the majority base their teachings on the Bible and believe
 in Jesus Christ.
- Are all these God's church? Does the Lord acknowledge all churches as His elect people, or does He have a special people? If so, how can God's church be identified?
- In every religion, there are sincere people who love God, but that does not necessarily
 mean that the church they attend is the true church. The word of God, and especially
 the prophecies, gives us some clues that will help us identify God's true remnant.
