

b) Its historical accuracy, proven by archaeology.

- Numerous discoveries in the Middle East confirm Biblical history amazingly.
- Cities such as Lachish, Tel Hazor, Megiddo, Nineveh and many others, whose locations were unknown, have been excavated by archaeologists.

c) More than 2,300 prophecies accurately fulfilled:

- It is interesting what the prophecies mention about empires such as Babylon, Tyre, Sidon, Egypt, and nations like that of the Jewish people.
- It contains predictions about scientific advances. It mentions cars and airplanes, the laws of gravity, the weight of air, the earth's roundness, etc., contrary to the knowledge of the time.
- Via various prophetic chains in the Book of Revelation, the political and religious history of about 2,000 years is told. We are told why Hitler and Napoleon lost the war, who will rule the world, the cause of the current world crisis, etc.
- There are 333 prophecies about a single man, which were written centuries before He was even born.
- d) The purity of its message. An example being the Ten Commandments.
- e) The people who were converted by it.

CONDEMNED CITIES

The city of Tyre, located in Asia Minor, was very rich. It traded with many countries but along with its increase in wealth; sin, vice, pride, idolatry and evil also increased.

Its inhabitants rejoiced when Jerusalem was destroyed by Nebuchadnezzar and they forgot the covenant they had made with King David, and delivered a whole nation into captivity. (Amos 1:9, 10) As a result of this...

Fulfillment of the prophecy: Nebuchadnezzar lay siege to Tyre for 13 years and abandoned it. Later, its inhabitants fled to an insular part of the city. After 200 years, Alexander the Great built an embankment from its rubble, and even its dust was thrown into the sea. In 7 months, he was able to conquer insular Tyre. It was never rebuilt.

WHAT IS THE CAUSE OF **SO MUCH SUFFERING?**

As a result of the bombings of the last world war, thousands were left homeless.

Children often wandered the dilapidated streets looking for their parents. Many never found them, as they either died or the cruelty of war had separated them. Their home, where they could be found, no longer existed.



There are crises in every sector of society, and every nation is experiencing upheaval. There are wars in the Middle East, battles in Central America, turmoil in Africa, insecurity on the streets, theft, violence, juvenile delinguency, etc. There is also a crisis in the financial world- inflation, the rising cost of living, misery, famine and strikes. Foreign debt threatens to strangle the economies of the Third World.

In nature, we also see crises - earthquakes, floods, drought and tornadoes, widespread freezes and sudden heat waves are more frequent. Families are also going through a crisis. In the USA, there are 6,500 divorces every day, which is more than a million a year. Among women between 30 and 40 years of age, six out of ten have gone through a divorce, which is a rate of 60%. In France, one in every two marriages ends in divorce.

World health is threatened. The number of AIDS patients is increasing rapidly, and soon the victims will number in the 18 millions. All this shows that something is happening, but what?

SIGNS OF THE END

Even though no one knows the exact day or time of Jesus' coming (Matthew 24:36), there will be certain characteristic signs pointing to the time of His coming. The anguish that we have just mentioned is one of the signs of the last times.

There have always been wars, but world wars are a product of our century. There is a frantic arms race. Small nations are becoming strong (Joel 3: 10). The nuclear weapons in existence today can destroy our planet 50 times over, not mentioning chemical weapons.

Modern day man is becoming increasingly sick; cancer, AIDS, and heart attacks are the plagues of today. Animals are kept artificially, and vegetables are treated with insecticides and chemical fertilizers for greater production.

This part of the statue represented GREECE (331-168 B.C.).

- The weapons used by the Greeks were made of bronze. Greek soldiers were called "brass soldiers."
- The belly: Alexander the Great was a slave to his stomach, he died very young due to the feasts he participated in. Alexander died at the age of 32, while drinking his second-round Herculean cup, which contained 5 liters of wine. His kingdom was later divided.
- The temporary sheen of bronze aptly depicted the passing glory of his kingdom.
- 7. What would the fourth kingdom, symbolized by the iron legs, be like? Verse 40.

THE ROMAN EMPIRE (163 B.C.- 476 A.D.)

- The Roman Empire lasted 644 years. It was rough and cold, just like iron. It was cruel and fearsome, and this can be seen by the atrocities committed by Nero and other emperors.
- The weapons used by the Romans were short iron swords.

8. What kind of a kingdom was represented by the feet of iron mixed with clay? Verses 41-43.

- The Roman Empire was divided into 10 parts between the fourth and fifth centuries. It weakened under the pressure of the Germanic tribes coming from the north of Europe. Finally, the territory of the Roman Empire was occupied by the Franks (France), Germans (Germany), Anglo-Saxons (England), Lombards (Italy), Suevi (Portugal), Visigoths (Spain) and Burgundians (Swiss). The Herules, Vandals and Ostrogoths have now disappeared. All these nations were partly strong and partly weak.
- They would try to reunite by intermarriage.
- Justinian, the Emperor of the East; Charles V; Philip II; Louis XIV; Napoleon; Wilhelm II and Hitler tried to achieve this unity by force to fulfill their dream of forming a great empire, but they all failed.

AN EXTRAORDINARY REVELATION OF THE FUTURE: DANIEL CHAPTER 2

Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, who lived about 600 B.C. had a very strange dream, but he forgot it. (Daniel 2:1). He summoned his sorcerers and astrologers to reveal to him the dream and its significance, but they could not do it. (Verses 2-11) The monarch signed a decree which commanded that all the wise men of Babylon, among whom were Daniel and his companions, should be put to death. (Verses 12-14). Daniel asked the king to give him some time, he and his companions prayed to God, and He revealed everything to him in a vision. (Verses 15-19).

4. What empire did the head of gold represent? Daniel 2:37-38._____

- This was a kingdom of great splendor. The city of Babylon had wide avenues and luxurious palaces. Its hanging gardens were one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. A large amount of soil had been placed on tiered terraces and giant trees grew there.
- There was gold in abundance. In the great temple of Marduk there was an image of Bel and an enormous table 12 x 4.50 m., both made of pure gold which weighed 23,000 kg. There were also lions and a sculpture made of the same metal, which was 5.40 m. tall.
- The city was apparently impregnable. According to Herodotus, a Greek historian, it was surrounded by a wall about 60 m. high and by a deep moat.
- It had enough provisions for 20 years. There was plenty of water since the Euphrates river flowed under its walls, right into the center of the city.
- 5. The chest and arms of silver symbolized MEDO-PERSIA (538-331 B.C.). How would the empire compare to the previous one? Verse 39.
