10 THE SECRET OF THE GOLDEN ARK



In ancient times, various cultures, such as the Incas, Aztecs, Mayas, and Egyptians, had valuable art treasures full of significance. The Egyptian tomb of Tutankhamen was special in that it was found intact while all the other tombs had been plundered.

What was even more extraordinary was the sanctuary that Moses built in the wilderness. Each utensil, especially the ones found in the Ark of the Covenant, had deep meaning. The dimensions, material, location, and ceremonies performed in the sanctuary all had valuable secrets. Does this have anything to do with us?

HOW WERE THE PEOPLE OF GOD SAVED IN OLD TESTAMENT TIMES?

1. When man sinned he was separated from God and, without God's intervention, was condemned to eternal death. From that moment on, his natural tendency was to do evil. He was weak and corrupted. When God placed man in Eden, He warned him that if he sinned he would die. Did this happen immediately? Who died in his place? Genesis 3:21.

Two lambs died in man's place. Adam and Eve received _____ as garments. They were his substitute, a symbol of the coming Savior.

2. When did God prepare an escape route to redeem man? 1 Peter 1:18-20.

3. What was the only way sin could be atoned? Hebrews 9:22. _____
That is why Abel's sacrifice was accepted and Cain's was not. God commanded the sinner bring an animal to die in his place. He would place his hands on the animal's head and confess his sins, which symbolized the transfer of his sins to an innocent victim.

GOD REVEALS HIMSELF TO MAN

4. God led the Israelites out of Egypt and guided them to the promised land in a miraculous way. He revealed His will and made His law known to them. What did God order Moses to do in a vision? Exodus 25:8, 40. _____

5. What were the dimensions of the courtyard surrounding the sanctuary? Exodus 27:9-19.
It had the following dimensions: length: 150 feet (100 cubits) over 20 bronze pillars; width: 75 feet (50 cubits) over 10 bronze pillars; height: 7.5 feet. One could not look over it.

6. What were the characteristics of the sanctuary?

The sanctuary, according to Exodus 26, measured 40.5 feet long, 9 feet wide, and 15 feet high. It was built of acacia wood overlaid with gold. The wood and gold symbolized the union of Christ's human and divine natures. The wood symbolized Christ as a man. The gold symbolized Christ as God.

It was covered by four different layers.

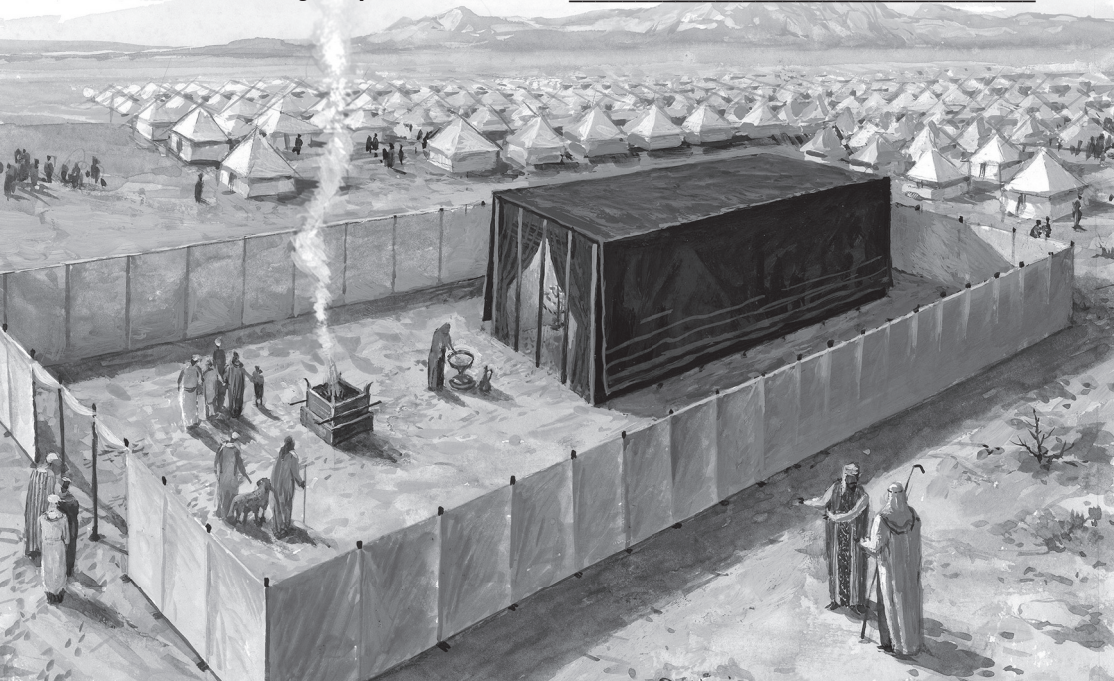
- The exterior was of brown and black badgers' skins and its appearance was not outstanding. It represented Christ's human nature.
- Beneath this layer was another of red rams' skins which symbolized Christ's suffering.
- The third layer was of white goats' hair, representing Christ's purity.

- Inside, beneath the other three layers, was a covering of white linen embroidered in blue, purple and scarlet; royal colors representing Christ as King.

The tabernacle was divided into two parts: the Holy Place and the Most Holy Place.

When the sinner placed his hands on the animal's head, he transferred his sins to the innocent victim, which died in his place. There is only one way to avoid eternal death and that is to find a substitute to die in our place, a sacrifice. Christ was that innocent sacrifice who died on Calvary.
 b) The horns were a sign of strength. They represent the power of Christ's sacrifice.

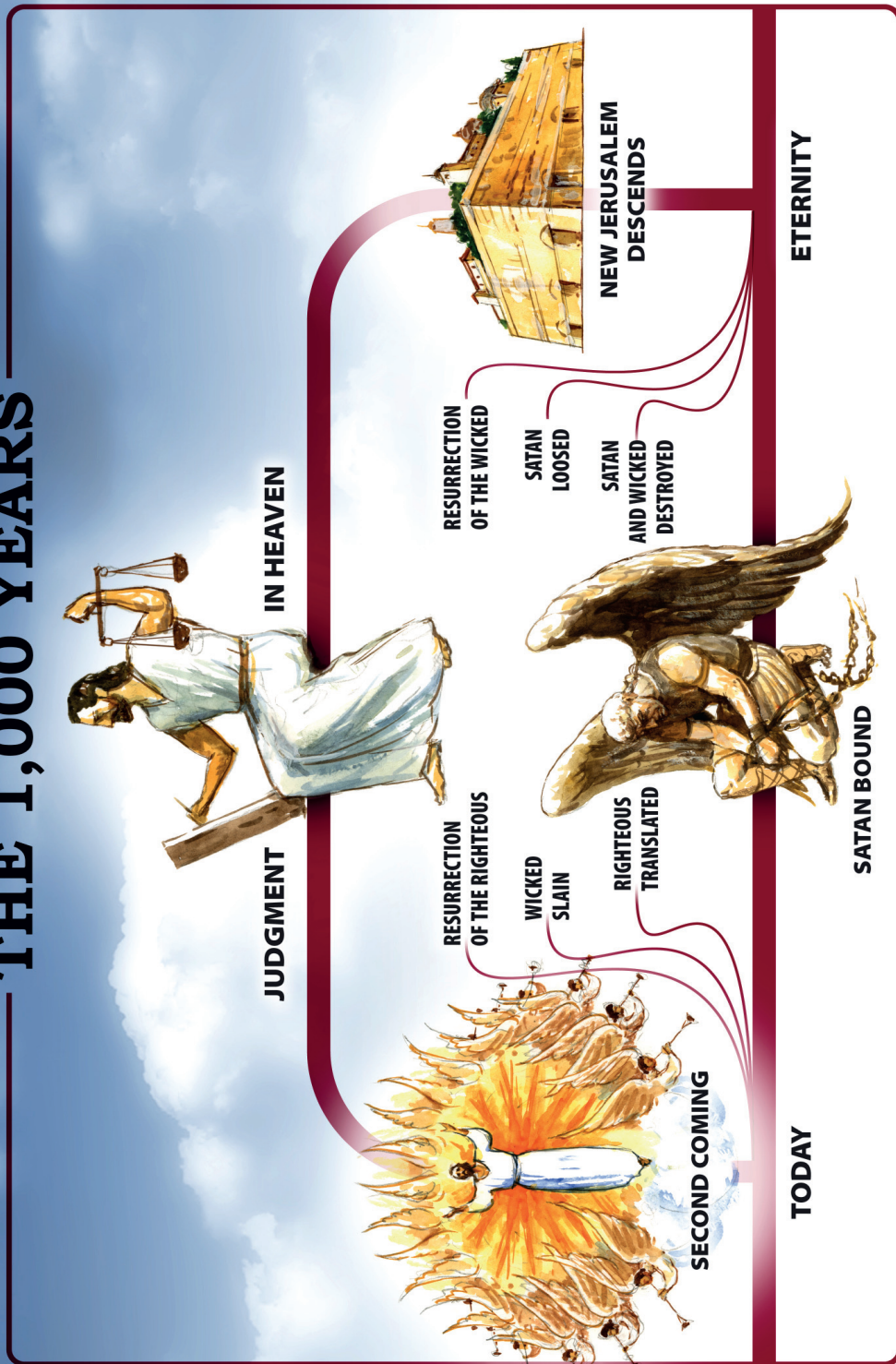

Maybe a reader learned that the third commandment says "sanctify the feasts." Why is there a difference in how the commandments are taught? Those who teach this commandment omit the second commandment and divide the last one into two, so they add up to 10. Keeping "the feasts" is not the same as honoring a specific day. God has not authorized any human being to change His law. We should accept it as it is written in the Bible.

God promises to give long life to those who honor their parents. There is no age limit to the obedience to this commandment.

This commandment protects the family unit. Every sexual relationship outside of marriage is condemned by God.

Are there contradictions in the Bible? No, there ARE NOT, although there may seem to be.

For example, Jesus Christ spoke in favor of the law in Luke 16:17, and so did the Apostle Paul in Romans 7:7, 12. In spite of this, it seems that the same apostle speaks against the law in Galatians 3:10, 13. Does he contradict himself?

When God created man, He put the principles of His Holy Law in his heart (Genesis 2:16, 17). ("thou shalt not ...").

Man, who was created with a free will, transgressed the law and was expelled from Eden (Genesis 3:24). Man had to die for his sin; but God, in His mercy, provided a temporary substitute, a lamb, which was a symbol of Christ, the Savior of humanity. The skins from the first victims provided clothing for man (Genesis 3:21).

The sacrifice of Abel was accepted. He offered a lamb, while his brother brought the fruit of the land and was rejected by God (Genesis 4:3, 4). To be forgiven, the sinner had to bring an animal to the sanctuary, place his hands on the animal's head, and sacrifice it. This symbolized that his sins were transferred to the animal, which died in his place (Leviticus 4:27-29). All these rites and ceremonies were a shadow or symbol pointing to Christ. For this reason, it is called the Ceremonial Law (Hebrews 10:1).

Besides civil laws of Israel, the Bible describes two other laws:

- a) The Ten Commandments, which can be compared to a mirror showing us our sinful condition.
- b) The ceremonial law, which included the sacrifices, ceremonies and festivals, which were a shadow or symbol of Christ and His work for mankind.

This law was given to man after his fall and was the means of his redemption until the Son of God came to die in this world, in our place.

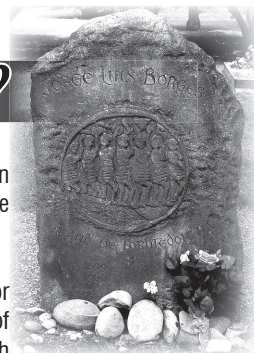

16 IS THERE LIFE AFTER DEATH?



Many times, we wonder what happens after death. There are those who, after an accident have been resuscitated and tell of their experience at the point of death. We often hear that the dead manifest themselves; some even speak with them.

Is it reasonable to be afraid of death?

Quite often we meet face to face with death; when we attend a funeral of a friend or a relative to say our goodbyes, or when we see a hearse followed by a procession of mourners in black. We wonder, is there life after death? Maybe when we place a wreath on a tomb we ask ourselves, do the dead have consciousness?

A wife, heartbroken by pain and flooded with tears wonders, will I ever see him again?

There are various opinions about this. Some say a person who dies goes directly to heaven, purgatory or hell; others believe he or she goes to the spirit world or reincarnates later in a newly born being; some say that all has come to an end; others say that a dead person knows nothing until the day of resurrection. Who is right? What does God say? What answer does the Bible give? Job 14:14.

THE PROCESS OF LIFE AND DEATH

1. To understand the process of death, we must first consider: how life began? Genesis 2:7.

The human being is composed of these two elements. God took the first element from dust of the ground. Man's body is composed of protein, fat, minerals (such as phosphorus, iron, magnesium, calcium, etc.), and a high percentage of water. The actual value of these elements is not more than \$5; this is the material value of our body. How little would we be worth without God's breath of life! The union of these two elements made man, a completely new being.

- If we expressed this with a mathematical equation we could say:
matter (earth) + **breath of life** = **living being** (living soul).
- When God created man, he became a living soul (living being); it does not say that God gave a soul or that man has a soul, but the union of matter and the breath of life made him a living being; therefore, man is a soul. When we say that 3,000 souls were baptized, we don't say that 3,000 spirits were baptized but persons.
- There are different chemical products that, when mixed, produce something totally different. For example, by mixing two atoms of hydrogen and one of oxygen, we get water, H₂O.
- If an electric lamp receives electricity, it produces light due to the electric current that reaches it. When the energy is shut off the light goes off. The lamp cannot give light by itself, and neither can electricity.

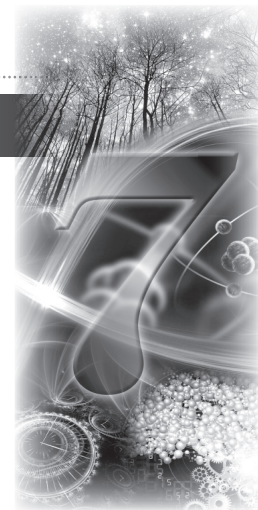

There are two dimensions to _____ . Love is the driving force to obey God.

Why did God give Moses two tables instead of one?

- On the first table are the first four commandments, which tell us how to love God. This is love in the first dimension.
- On the second table, we find the last six commandments, which are related to our neighbors. This is the second dimension of love.

LOVE IN THE FIRST DIMENSION

6. How do we show our love to God in reference to the first three commandments? Exodus 20:3-7.

- a) Putting God in first place; above our material interests, our vanity, personal honor, etc.
- b) Not worshiping Him as we think but as He has commanded, in spirit and truth.
- c) Treating His name with respect and reverence.

7. How do we show our love to God when we keep the Sabbath? Exodus 20:8-11.

By planning out our work week on the first day of the week so we can dedicate the seventh day entirely to God. We remember with gratitude God's creative work in two ways (Psalms 118:24):

Physically: enjoy peace on the day of rest by spending it in nature.

Spiritually: rejoice in the change Christ has brought about in us. It should not be a mere physical rest but a rest in which Christ, the Author and Lord of the Sabbath, becomes our spiritual rest through His work of justification (Hebrews 4:1, 2, 9, 10). Every Sabbath should be a foretaste of eternal life.

8. When does the Sabbath begin and end? What does the Bible call the sixth day?

- a) According to the Bible, a day starts the moment the sun sets. Leviticus 23:32; Nehemiah 13:19.
- b) Friday, the sixth day, is called the day of preparation. Mark 15:19.

1. The miracle of the manna in the desert. God knew the day He had sanctified. God gave a double portion of manna on Friday and none on Sabbath (Exodus 16:4-35). God performed this miracle in the desert about 2000 times.
2. Christ and His disciples kept the Sabbath (Luke 4:16; 23:54-56). Did the Son of God keep a false day for 33 years?

13. What kind of Sabbaths did Paul refer to in Colossians 2:16, 17: the ceremonial rest days, which were a shadow of Christ, or the seventh day?

In the ceremonial law, written by Moses in a book (Deuteronomy 31:24-26), there are seven annual feasts, which took place the first and seventh month. These feasts (Passover, the feast of unleavened bread, First Fruits, Pentecost, Feast of Trumpets, Day of Atonement, and the Feast of Tabernacles) were also called Sabbaths or days of rest. They had nothing to do with the fourth commandment (Leviticus 23:38, 39). They were a shadow or symbol of Christ.

15. Most people observe Sunday; can so many people be wrong? Who will be lost? Matthew 7:13, 14.

- a) It is not about taking sides of the majority or the minority but about being on Jesus' side.
- b) Many people say: "My parents and grandparents always observed Sunday, and I do not want to do differently." Who will God judge and condemn: those who sinned in ignorance or those who sin consciously? Acts 17:30; James 4:17.

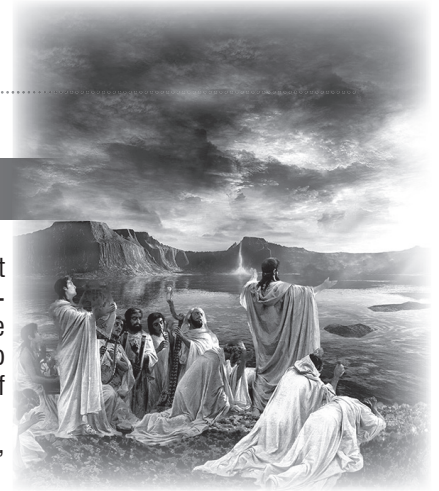

14 THE WORST FALSIFICATION IN HISTORY



Falsification abounds in every aspect of society. We find it in science, the economics of art, literature, and more. Unfortunately, there are also falsifications in religious matters. The worst falsification of all ages is that of pagan rites of sun worship that have been subtly introduced in Christianity, to the point of substituting sun worship for one of the Ten Commandments.

Sun worship is the oldest. Mithras, Aurora, Marduk, Baal, Ra, Osiris and Shamash were gods that represented the sun.

DISGUISED SUN WORSHIP

1. What abomination did the prophet Ezekiel see in vision? Ezekiel 8:15-18.

God pronounced a very severe sentence against sun worshipers (Ezekiel 6:4-6).

2. Who tried to introduce pagan customs into Christianity? Why?

Emperor Constantine (280-337 A.D.) noticed that Rome's political power was weakening due to the differences existing between pagan worshipers and Christians. He then attempted to bring these two large ideological groups together. In 313 A.D., he published the Edict of Milan, in which he granted religious tolerance and complete freedom to Christians.

As a result, they showed great admiration for the Emperor. Pagans worshiped many gods, Mithras being one of the main sun gods.

Mithras was worshiped on Sunday. Even today, the first day of the week in English is Sunday and in German is Sonntag; both mean day of the sun when translated.

To fulfill his political agenda, Constantine himself became a Christian and established Sunday, the day of the sun, as a day of rest, in place of the Sabbath kept by faithful Christians, thus maintaining a link with sun worshipers.

Many became "Christians" and introduced a great number of pagan customs into Christianity. Cardinal John Henry Newman in his book "Development of Christian Doctrine", p. 373, declares: "Eusebius tells us that Constantine, when recommending the new religion to the heathen, transferred to it the external ornaments to which the heathen were accustomed in their own cult: the use of temples which were dedicated to special saints, ornaments made occasionally out of branches of tree, incense, lamps, candles, votive offerings for the healing of the sick, holy water, seasonal festivities, the use of the calendar, processions, the blessing of the fields, priestly garments, the wedding ring, the custom of facing the east, and later icons, maybe ecclesiastical chanting and the "Kyrie Eleison", all these customs having their origin in paganism and being sanctified when adopted by the church."

The Encyclopedia Britannica (9th version), in the article "Sunday" states: "The earliest recognition of the observance of Sunday as a legal duty is a constitution of Constantine in 321 A.D. (March 7) enacting that all courts of justice, inhabitants of towns, and workshops were to be at rest on Sunday (venerably die soils) with an exception in favor of those engaged in agricultural labor."

3. Constantine was just an emperor, so how was the observance of Sunday introduced into the church?

The change of the rest day was accepted by the Church of Rome. A catechism that received the apostolic blessing of Pope Pius X (on January 25, 1910) clarifies it:

- Question: What is the day of rest?
- Answer: Saturday is the day of rest.
- Question: Why do we observe Sunday instead of Saturday?
- Answer: We observe Sunday instead of Saturday because the Catholic Church, in the Synod of Laodicea (336 A.D.), transferred the solemnity from Saturday to Sunday. Peter Geiermann, The Convert's Catechism of Catholic Doctrine, 1946 ed., p. 50.

DOES GOD ALLOW HIS LAW TO BE CHANGED?

DO THE EIGHT BIBLE TEXTS THAT MENTION THE FIRST DAY OF THE WEEK MENTION A CHANGE IN THE DAY OF REST?

8. Do the five texts regarding the resurrection, which took place on the first day of the week, mention any change of the day of rest? Matthew 28:1; Mark 16:1, 2; 16:9; Luke 24:1; John 20:1.

9. Why did the disciples gather on the first day of the week? John 20:19.

Because they were afraid of the _____

More evidence that they did not gather to keep Sunday in honor of the resurrection is that they did not even believe that Christ had risen. Mark 16:12-14.

10. Why did Paul extend a service at Troas, on the night of the first day of the week? What did he do the next day at dawn? Acts 20:7, 11. _____

- a) In the Bible, a new day began at sunset, not midnight, and thus this was after the Sabbath. Many verses show that Paul worshiped on Sabbath; but on this particular occasion, since he had to leave at daybreak, he prolonged his speech until midnight.
- b) If Paul kept Sunday, he would not have undertaken such a long trip that day. A change of the day of rest is not mentioned.
- c) They broke bread every day (Acts 2:46).

11. In advising to set aside an offering for the poor in Jerusalem, did Paul tell the brethren to gather or simply to set the money aside? 1 Corinthians 16:2.

It does not speak of a change of the day of rest.

THERE IS NOT ONE SINGLE BIBLE TEXT THAT SHOWS THAT THE FIRST DAY OF THE WEEK SHOULD BE OBSERVED

Let us look at some official quotations:

- Cardinal Gibbons wrote: "You may read the Bible from Genesis to Revelation, and YOU WILL NOT FIND A SINGLE LINE AUTHORIZING THE SANCTIFICATION OF SUNDAY. The Scriptures enforce the religious observance of Saturday, a day which we never sanctify." The Faith of Our Fathers, 1917 ed.; pp. 72, 73.
- "The concept of a formal substitution of the first day for the seventh day of the week and the transference, maybe in a spiritual way, of the Sabbath rest established in the fourth commandment IS NOT BASED EITHER IN THE HOLY SCRIPTURES OR IN ANCIENT CHRISTIANITY." Smith and Cheatham, Dictionary of Christian Antiquities, article on the Sabbath.
- Dr. Edward T. Hiscox, author of the Baptist Manual made the following declaration before a group of pastors: "There was and there is a commandment to be observed as holy: the Sabbath, but that day is Saturday and not Sunday. It could be said, therefore, that the Sabbath was transferred from the seventh to the first day. Where can the registration of such a change be found? Not in the New Testament since there is absolutely nothing regarding it." From an article read at the Conference of Ministers in New York, on November 13, 1893.

SOME QUESTIONS REGARDING THE SABBATH

12. How do we know that today's Sabbath is the same that God sanctified in creation? Haven't there been changes to the calendar?

- a) If we look at a Christian, Oriental, Muslim, Coptic or Jewish calendar we see that the years change, but the Sabbath remains the same. In the Jewish calendar, the year 5778 is equivalent to our year 2018.
- b) The Julian calendar dates to the year 46 B.C., and it was corrected in 1582 and renamed the Gregorian calendar; that is the calendar we use today.
When astronomers discovered that spring began at a different time; the calendar dates were moved 10 days forward. On Thursday, October 4, 1582, people went to bed at night and woke up on Friday, October 15. The weekly cycle remained unchanged.
