7. What do the four beasts represent? Daniel 7:16, 17, 23.

- They are the same kingdoms represented in the statue of Daniel chapter 2.

8. What were the characteristics of the first beast? Daniel 7:4.

A _____ with two _____.

- Represents Babylon (606 - 538 B.C.).
- Just as gold is the most precious metal, the lion is the king of the jungle.
- The two wings represent Nebuchadnezzar's speedy conquests.

9. What did the second beast look like? Daniel 7:5.

- Represent Medo-Persia (538 - 331 B.C.).
- It leans on one side, representing the superiority of the Persians over the Medes.
- It held three ribs in its mouth, depicting its conquest of three provinces - Babylon, Lydia and Egypt.
- It devours much meat, meaning they were very vicious in their conquests.

10. What characterized the leopard depicted in verse 6?

It had _____ and _____. This represents the Greek Empire (331 - 168 B.C.).

- The four wings represent the speed of conquest - twice that of Nebuchadnezzar. It took Alexander the Great only 8 years to conquer an area of 5 million square kilometers.
- Four heads: When Alexander the Great died (323 B.C.), his empire was divided among his four generals: Lysimachus ruled over Thrace; Cassander over Greece; Seleucus over Syria and Babylon, and Ptolemy over Egypt.

11. What was the fourth beast like? Verses 7, 19, 20, 23.

- The fourth beast represents Rome (169 B.C. - A.D. 176). Its cruelty is represented by its bronze nails and iron teeth.
- The ten horns are equivalent to the ten toes in Daniel 2, and they represent the ten nations of Western Europe, which remained at the end of the Roman Empire (Verse 24).

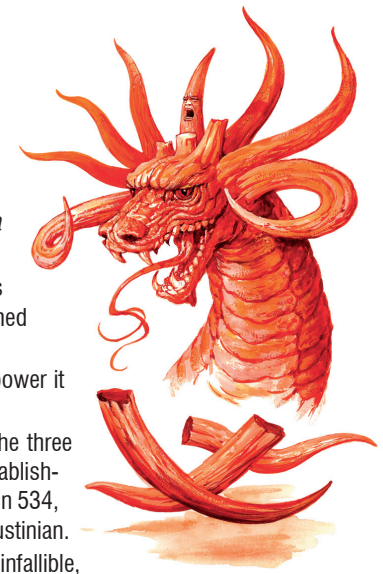
THE SMALL HORN

12. What characterized the small horn that came up?

Verses 8, 20-25.

When this horn came up, _____ were plucked up. It had _____ like of a man and a _____ that spoke great things.

- a) It was different from the other horns, which means that it was not a political power but a religious one. Which power assumed the place of Imperial Rome? The papacy.
- b) It was bigger than the other beasts, apart from its religious power it also had political power. Its influence is still powerful today.
- c) The three horns that fell when this one came up represent the three Aryan kings who were defeated and destroyed before the establishment of the papacy. In the year 493, the Heruli were defeated; in 534, the Vandals; and in 538, the Ostrogoths were conquered by Justinian.
- d) It would speak against the Most High. The Pope calls himself infallible, gives indulgences, and calls himself the Holy Father, attributes that belong only to God (Matthew 23:9).



13. What would the little horn do to the saints, the true believers? Daniel 7:21.

This reminds us of the dark ages mentioned in history, when millions of Christians who were called heretics were put to death by various horrible means during the "Inquisition."

14. What did that power think to change according to the prophecy? Verse 25.

The Ten Commandments were changed. In the catechism, the second commandment is omitted and the tenth is divided into two. The fourth commandment, which commands the observance of the Sabbath (Saturday) as the true day of rest, has been substituted by "keep holy the Lord's day." God has not authorized anyone to change His holy law (Matthew 5:16, 17; Ecclesiastes 3:14).

15. How long was the persecution to last? Daniel 7:25, last part.

A time is equal to a year; times is equal to two years; and the dividing of times is equal to half a year, totaling three and a half years. If we calculate a biblical year as having 360 days, it's 1,260 days. This



is the same calculation that is mentioned in Revelation 12:6, 14 and 13:5. These 1,260 prophetic days are 1,260 literal years. This is the period starting in 538, when the papacy's supremacy began, to 1798. During the French Revolution, Napoleon sent General Berthier to take Pope Pius VI captive. This Pope died in exile.

CONCLUSION

- God Himself guides the destiny of nations.
- Prophecy outlines the development of history and the war between light and darkness, but Christ is the victor, and all who believe in Him will share in this great victory.
- This prophecy clearly shows that Christ does not change His law, but the antichrist attempted to do so. Let not men change God's truth.
- Let us acknowledge the eternal validity of the Ten Commandments because Jesus Christ wants us to keep them and He wishes to bless those who accept Him as their Savior and Lord.

21 THE FASCINATING PROPHECY OF THE 2,300 YEARS



There are about 2,300 fascinating prophecies in the Bible. They have more than ten accurate mathematical predictions. They are God’s clock. In the prophecy of the 2,300 years, fascinating revelations show us the development of history - the rise and fall of kingdoms, the year of Christ’s baptism and death, the time when the truth that the antichrist has overthrown will be restored, and the beginning of the time of the end. It is a prophecy worth knowing!

THE PROPHECY OF DANIEL 8

1. What did Daniel see in vision on the banks of the Ulai river? Daniel 8:3-9.

- A _____ with two horns, one _____ the other, and the ram pushed forward towards the north and south, wounding its opponent. No other animal could resist him.
- A _____ came from the west, so fast that it did not touch the ground. It had a single _____ between its eyes. It cast the _____ down to the ground and broke its two horns. Then, in its greatest strength its own horn was broken and four horns came up in its place.
- Out of one came a _____, which grew exceedingly great toward the south, the east and the _____ (Palestine).

2. Whom did the ram symbolize? Verses 15, 16, 20.

It symbolized the _____.

It charged with its horns toward the east (Greece), the north and the south (Egypt). This prophecy was fulfilled in 550 B.C. when Babylon was still in power.

3. What did the goat symbolize? Verses 21, 22.

.....
Its first king was Alexander the Great. The statement “it did not touch the ground” depicts Alexander’s speed as a conqueror. In only 8 years he conquered the then known world, and his dominion reached as far as India. He died at the height of his glory. 4 horns - four generals succeeded Alexander and divided the kingdom into 4 parts: Macedonia, Thrace, Syria-Babylon and Egypt.

4. What came out of one of the horns? Verses 9, 23, 25.

.....
Compare these verses with the little horn in Daniel 7. That horn that grew referred to Rome in its dual facets: pagan Rome and papal Rome. It grew, and its conquests spread out to the east towards Greece, Asia, and towards the south to Africa, Carthage and Egypt. The pleasant land referred to is Palestine. “The place of his sanctuary was overthrown” (verse 11). Rome opposed Christ. In A.D. 70, the Roman army destroyed Jerusalem. Papal Rome was the continuation of the pagan Rome of the Caesars and it would “destroy... the holy people” (verse 24). This referred to the Inquisition. “... and by him the daily sacrifice was taken away” (Verse 11). We are justified by Christ; He intercedes for us. But the church created a series of human mediators. With the institution of the mass, in which the priest becomes a mediator, and the teaching of justification by works, Christ was displaced. It cast down the truth, acted according to its own will and prospered. It attempted to change the law of God by substituting Sunday for the Bible Sabbath and introducing human commandments.

30 THE SECRET TO SUCCESS



Every human being wants to be successful. KEY REVELATIONS TO THE PROPHECY OF DANIEL 9

After a fervent prayer in which Daniel humbled himself before God, he received the answer (Daniel 9:20-23), the full explanation of the 2,300 years mentioned in the previous chapter.

7. How many prophetic weeks were determined or cut off from the 2,300 days for the people of Israel? (Verse 24). _____

How many literal years are there in 70 prophetic weeks? If we use the prophetic key of 1 day = 1 year (Ezekiel 4:6; Numbers 14:34), we conclude that 70 weeks times the seven days of the week = 490 prophetic days or 490 literal years.

8. What would happen during those 490 years of grace for the Jewish people? Verse 24.

_____ would be put to end, _____ would be atoned for, and _____ would be achieved through the sacrifice of Christ. The vision and prophecy would be sealed, as the 333 prophecies concerning Jesus were fulfilled. The Saint of Saints would be _____. The name Christ means "anointed one".

9. What was the starting point for the 2,300 years and the 70 weeks that are a part of prophecy? Daniel 9:25.

The date when the order _____
The starting point in these mathematical calculations is the year 457 B.C. (the third quarter), when Artaxerxes, king of Persia, signed the decree to rebuild the city of Jerusalem (Ezra 7:7; 6:14). Jerusalem was deserted because the Jews were exiled in Babylon.

10. In what year would the 2,300 days end?

There are 456 years and one quarter in the B.C. era. To complete the 2,300 years, we need 1,843 years and a quarter, and that takes us to the third quarter of the year A.D. 1844, which is exactly 2,300 years. The year 1844 is the end of this long prophetic period.

THE 70 WEEKS PROPHECY

11. How many weeks were there to the coming of the Messiah? Daniel 9:25.

- _____ weeks and _____ weeks.
- a) Seven weeks are 49 days or 49 years. This was the time it took to rebuild the temple and the walls of Jerusalem. What year does that bring us to? 408 B.C. (407 and a quarter).
 - b) To reach the year of Christ's baptism we calculate 62 weeks x 7 = 434 literal years. We subtract those years from our diagram starting at the year 407 and a quarter, and we are left with 26 years and three-quarters. This places us in the year A.D. 27, the year in which Christ was baptized. Galatians 4:4.; Matthew 3:13-17.

7. Does the Bible say anything about the length of ladies' hair? 1 Corinthians 11:14, 15.

- Will an unkempt, filthy, disheveled person please God? Certainly not. We should wear things that are in good taste, purchase or make clothes of good quality, when possible, and abide by the rules of good hygiene.
- We should radiate freshness, gentleness and simplicity so everyone can see something different in us. However, we should avoid being influenced by fashion or the opinion of others.
- Let us maintain a noble independence, trying to live for God. The joy of having loved and obeyed Jesus will be our reward. In Isaiah 3:16-26, we can read the fate of vanity and disobedience.

12. What year would Christ be crucified? Daniel 9:26, 27.

After the sixty-two weeks. To complete the 70 weeks, we need one week (7 years). What would happen in this last week, or seven years? The 62 weeks ended in the year A.D. 27; if we add 7 years we reach the year A.D. 34.

At mid-week, the sacrifice and offering would cease. This is the year A.D. 31, in the month of Nisan in the Hebrew calendar, which corresponds to our month of April, the eve of the Jewish Easter. Jesus was crucified on that date, in the spring of the year A.D. 31, by order of Pilate.

Bible prophecy is very accurate! The sacrifices would cease because they symbolized Christ. When He died for our sins, there was no more need to shed the blood of animals. At the very moment Jesus died, the veil of the temple was torn in two (Matthew 27:51).

**13. When did the time given to Israel as God's people end? What happened to Jerusalem?
Verses 24, 26.**

At the end of the _____ weeks or _____ years.

This period ended in the year A.D. 34. Three and a half years after Jesus' death, the gospel was preached only to the Jews. The Roman soldiers besieged Jerusalem in the year A.D. 70 and after reducing it to famine, it was taken, burned and destroyed, leaving more than one million of its inhabitants dead.

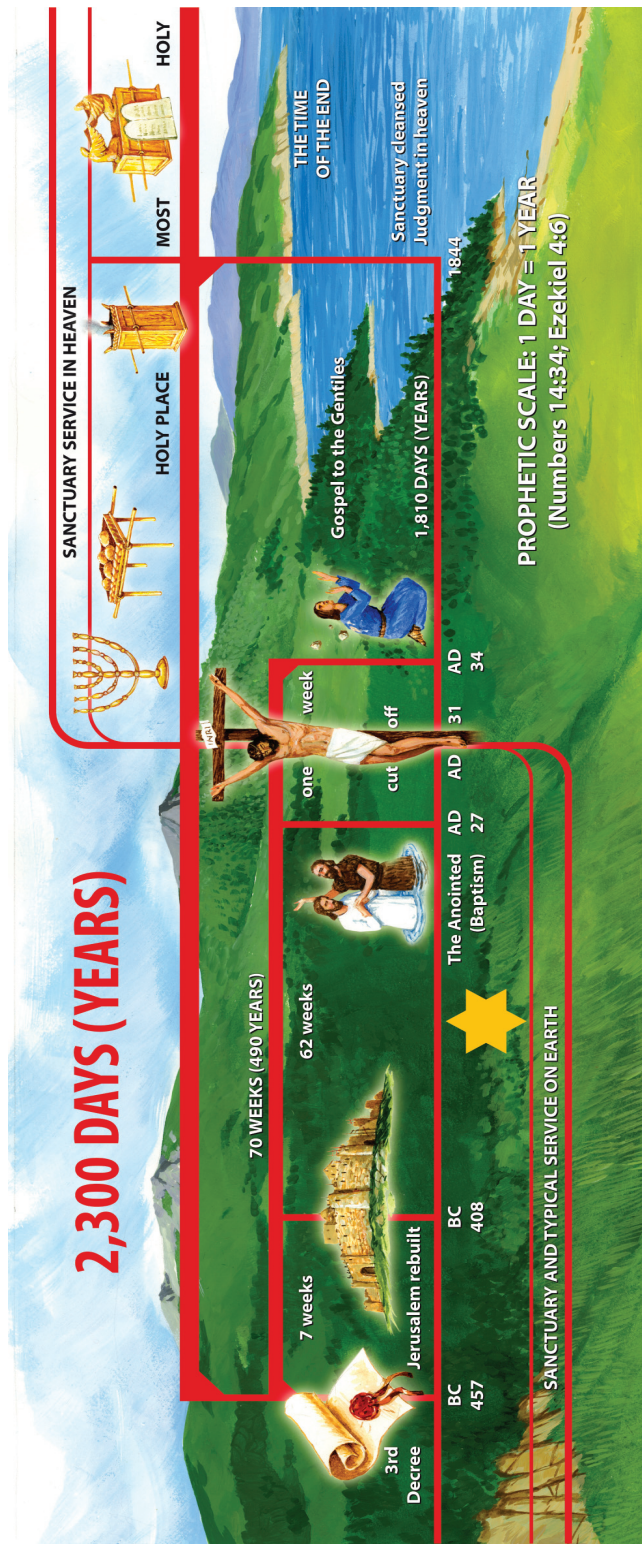
CONCLUSION

The accuracy of Bible prophecy, particularly these mathematical calculations, is a seal or guarantee of biblical validity and is the irrefutable proof that the Bible was inspired by God. The prophecy of the 70 weeks is clear proof that Christ was the promised Messiah. The end of the 2,300 years in 1844 mark the time for the restoration of the truth and the purification of the sanctuary.

What does true beauty consist of? How can we obtain it?

There was once a very attractive young lady whose face was very pretty and whose body was slender and symmetrical. She had lovely silky hair, and smooth, rosy skin. She could have won a beauty contest. A young man who admired her very much had the opportunity to get to know her in her own environment. He soon realized that she was selfish, proud and false and expressed herself in a very vulgar way. He was deeply disappointed, because he had been deceived by her appearance.

True beauty is not found in the external appearance or personal care, such as make-up, jewels or fancy clothes, but in a gentle, attractive character.

How nice it is to be in the company of a person who has a beautiful character even if she is not that physically beautiful!

It is not important how man sees us; what counts is how God sees us.

ADORNMENT OF THE SOUL

When a potter works with clay and shapes a pot, he works from the inside out. God also wants to change us inside so the expression of His holy will can be seen on the outside. **This process is called sanctification.**

Our thoughts, feelings and actions must be sanctified. In our manner of eating, dressing, speaking and living, it should be noticeable that we are followers of Jesus.

22 MY DEFENSE BEFORE THE SUPREME COURT



In one of Jesus' parables, we are told the story of a king who gave a wedding party for his son. Matthew 22:1-14.

- The wedding invitation is the gospel.
- The first invitation was given to the people of Israel from the time of Christ's baptism until His death.
- The second invitation was also given to the Jews after Christ's death, for three and a half years more, up to Stephen's death.
- The third invitation, once the Jews rejected God's invitation, was addressed to the Gentiles.
- Where did these guests, who were invited from the streets and roadsides, get their wedding garments?

In ancient times, it was customary in the East for the king to provide proper garments at wedding celebrations to each guest upon entering the banquet. This garment is the symbol of Jesus' righteousness. He covers our filthy works of the past and declares us righteous. The person who is not wearing the wedding garment will stand before a judgment. If we do not wear the garment of Christ's righteousness, if we do not accept Him as our Savior and Lord and do not do His will, we are condemned and cast out of God's presence.

God said to Adam and Eve, "Ye shall not eat of it... lest ye die." Man sinned and was condemned to death, but Christ offered to die in man's place. Until the moment came, an animal was sacrificed, representing Christ's sacrifice (Hebrews 9:9).

6. In the sanctuary built in the wilderness there were two compartments separated by a veil, the Holy Place and the Most Holy. How often did the priests enter the Holy Place, and for what purpose? Hebrews 9:6. _____

In Leviticus 4 we read about different kinds of sin: • If a person sinned, he was required to present an animal without blemish, place his hands on the animal's head, thus transferring his sins to the animal, and then kill it. Then, the priest took the blood, sprinkled it on the horns of the altar, and poured the rest at the foot of the altar. • If a priest or the congregation of Israel sinned, he had to take some of the blood from the sacrifice, then enter the Holy Place and sprinkle blood on the veil. In this way, he transferred the sin to the sanctuary.

7. Who was the only one who entered the Most Holy Place, and how often? Hebrews 9:7. _____

The _____ entered the Most Holy Place once a _____.

On the Day of Atonement, the sanctuary was cleansed. First, the high priest sacrificed a bull for himself and his family. Then, he took two goats and cast a lot over them, one symbolizing the Lord, and the other, the scapegoat or Satan. The one that represented Jesus was sacrificed. The high priest took the blood and entered the Most Holy in a cloud of incense; there he sprinkled the mercy seat, the Ark of the Covenant, which represents the throne of God, seven times with his finger. In the most Holy Place was the light of the SHEKINAH or divine presence. The law that was transgressed required the death of the sinner and that law was beneath the mercy seat. When the priest sprinkled the blood, mercy was granted to the transgressor. Thus, the veil was cleansed just by the presence of God in that place and the people were forgiven (Leviticus 16:16). Then they brought the goat, and the high priest placed his hands on its head and confessed all the sins of Israel and then the animal was led into the wilderness.

The temple of God was open in heaven (Rev. 11:19) and Christ was seen wearing the garments of a priest (Rev. 1:12-15), and walking among the candlesticks. He presents Himself, in the form of an angel, as ministering before the altar, holding a gold censer and receiving the prayers of the saints (Rev. 8:3, 4).

- In Revelation, "a Lamb as it had been slain" is mentioned (Revelation 5:6; 13:8).

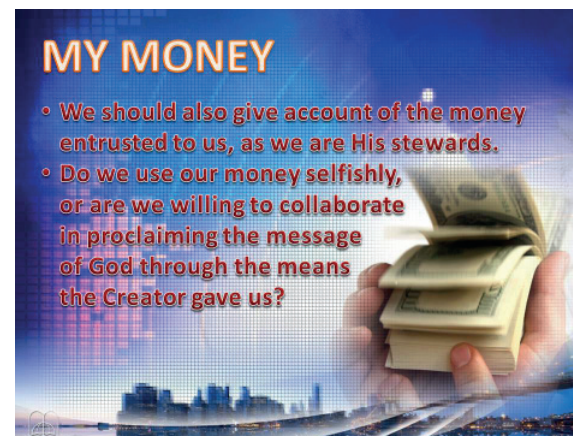

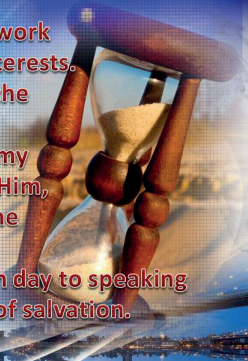

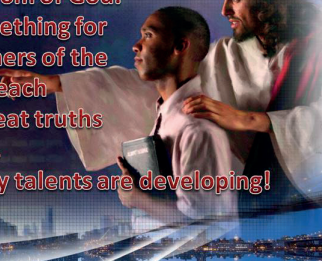

23 WHY ARE THERE SO MANY RELIGIONS?



Many ask themselves this question when they see that:

- There are hundreds of religious groups and thousands of sects. Each group claims to possess the truth, and the majority base their teachings on the Bible and believe in Jesus Christ.
- Are all these God's church? Does the Lord acknowledge all churches as His elect people, or does He have a special people? If so, how can God's church be identified?
- In every religion, there are sincere people who love God, but that does not necessarily mean that the church they attend is the true church. The word of God, and especially the prophecies, gives us some clues that will help us identify God's true remnant.

SYMBOLS REPRESENTING THE CHURCH

1. **What is the true church compared to, in both the Old and the New Testament? Isaiah 5:1, 2, 7; Matthew 21:33.**

- The vine (John 15:1, 2, 4): Christ is the stock of that vine. He is eternal. We are the branches. If we abide in Him we will bear fruit, otherwise we will be cut off.
- The wall: its purpose is to establish a border between the land of the Lord and the rest. This wall protects the church as long as it does God's will. The wall symbolizes God's law. The area outside the law of God is sin (1 John 3:4).

Any church that leaves out any of God's commandments makes a hole in the wall.

A businessman has to invest his money well to make a profit. A farmer has to sow and properly manage his crops to have a good harvest. Many people would feel honored, and would consider it a privilege if they were asked to invest in a prosperous commercial enterprise. That is exactly what God invites us to do. 24 666 AND THE UNITED STATES IN PROPHECY



Who can the number 666 be applied to?

There are many theories and speculations about this issue. Some attribute this number to Hitler. There are films that relate it to spiritualism and exorcism. Others associate this number with an enormous computer. Reality is quite different: the symbolic beast of Revelation 13, whose number is 666, is the same power represented by the little horn of Daniel 7.

THE FIRST BEAST OF REVELATION 13

1. Where did this beast come from, and what details show the geographical location of its headquarters? Revelation 13:1, 2.

- It rose up from the _____. This shows that this power came from a place with a large population.
- It had _____ heads and _____ horns. Revelation 17:9 states that the seven heads represent seven hills.
- The body of this beast was similar to that of a leopard, its feet were like those of a bear, and its mouth like a lion's.

These are the same beasts that represented Greece, Medo-Persia and Babylon in Daniel 7.

Undoubtedly, the beast of Revelation 13 had the same characteristics that predominated in those kingdoms of the past.

2. What did the beast of Revelation 13 receive from the dragon mentioned, as mentioned in Revelation 12 (Satan and Rome of the Caesars)? Revelation 13:2.

... And the dragon gave him _____, and _____, and great authority.

- The only power which received its seat and authority from pagan Rome is the papacy.
- This power would exist until the end of time, since the prophecy mentions the beast during the fifth plague (Revelation 13:9, 10; 16:10, 11).
- It is mentioned several times as Babylon (Revelation 14:8, 17:5, 18:2-4).

3. What correlation is there between the beast of Revelation 13 and the little horn of Daniel 7?

THE BEAST OF REVELATION 13

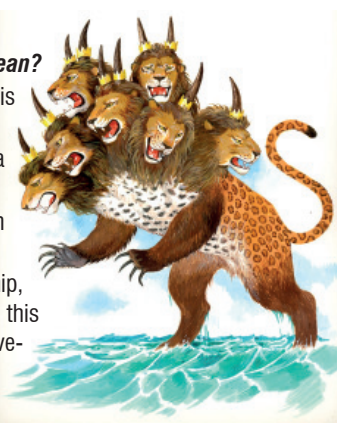
- It had a mouth that spoke great things and blasphemies (Revelation 13:5).
- It blasphemed against _____ (verse 6).
- It was permitted to make war with the saints and to overcome them (verse 7).
- It would play its part for 42 months, which corresponds to the 1,260 days or "for a time, and times, and half a time" (Revelation 12:6, 14).
- It was given power over kindreds, tongues, and nations (Revelation 13:7).
- It would be led into captivity and killed with the sword (verse 10).

THE HORN OF DANIEL 7

- It had a mouth that spoke great things (Daniel 7:8).
- It spoke great words against the Most High (verse 25).
- It made war with the saints and prevailed against them (verse 21).
- They were given into its hands until "a time, and times, and a half time" (Daniel 7:25).
- It was more stout than its fellows (verse 20).
- The judge would take away its dominion and destroy it in the end (verse 26).

NOTE: What does blasphemy and speaking against the Most High mean?

- The papacy claims to forgive sins, while in fact only God can do this (Mark 2:7).
- By being called "Holy Father," the pope is attributing to himself a name that belongs only to God (Matthew 23:9).
- He pretends to be the head of the church, thus taking the position that belongs to Christ (Ephesians 5:23; 4:15).
- Allowing people to kneel before him is an act of praise and worship, which belongs only to God. Peter did not permit Cornelius to do this (Acts 10:25, 26), and neither did the angel allow John to do so (Revelation 19:10; 22:8, 9).
- For this reason, when Paul referred to the "man of sin," he said that he sat in the temple of God, "showing himself that he is God" (2 Thessalonians 2:3, 4). The word *antichrist* means one that is against Christ, or takes His place.

It received a _____ which was healed; and all the inhabitants of the earth _____ the beast (Revelation 13:5).

During the period of the 1,260 prophetic days or 1,260 years (Ezekiel 4:6) following the decree of Justinian (A.D. 538), great persecution was carried out against the dissident Christians by the so-called "Holy Inquisition." Not only in France, Spain and all of Europe, but also in the American colonies, Mexico and Peru; more than 50 million people were tortured and killed. In 1798, on the very date the 1,260 years ended, that power received a mortal wound. General Berthier, following the orders of Napoleon, took Pope Pius VI captive (Revelation 13:10), abolished Justinian's decree, confiscated the five states the papacy had in the center of Italy, and seized the temporal (political) power that the pope possessed. It looked as if the papacy would never recover from that mortal wound.

6. What happened to the deadly wound? Revelation 13:3, 4, 8.

It was _____, and all the world _____.
 The wound was healed. Gradually, the papacy regained its influence. In 1929, Benito Mussolini signed an agreement with the pope, giving him the 44 acres that compose the Vatican state. The popularity of the pope increases daily as he visits protestants, orientals, communists and even the United Nations. Practically the whole world worships him, praises him, and thus worships the dragon for which the pope is an instrument and from whom he received his power (Revelation 13:2-4).

➤ **Six: Avoid stimulants and drugs.**

- Tobacco is a merciless murderer of millions of people. One in five smokers dies of cancer. We should not destroy our body, because it is the temple of God (1 Corinthians 3:16, 17).

11. What other stimulants are detrimental to our health?

- Coffee, tea, mate, and soft drinks all contain caffeine (mateine and theine are similar), which affects the nervous system and produces physical distress. They should, therefore be avoided.
- Drugs such as LSD, morphine, marijuana, cocaine, and certain medicines make the body sick, destroy the mind, degrade the soul, and offend our Creator.

➤ **Seven: Use natural medicines, and ask God for help.**

Jesus used clay to cure a blind man, and He recommended the use of water (John 9:6-12). King Hezekiah was cured with a fig poultice (2 Kings 20:5-7), showing God's approval of natural methods of healing.

The Bible foretells that there will be many false miracles and wonders at the end of time. There may be salvation without a cure and a cure without salvation. Many will be deceived at the final judgment (Matthew 7:21-23).

Let us glorify God in our body (1 Corinthians 10:31). Jesus, in His unparalleled love, gave His life to save me; should I neglect to take care of this body, which He created and for which He died?

- Avoid hormones, vaccines, and general injections that are administered to animals to enter our body.
- More resistance since our body is not full of toxins.
- Increased longevity.

MORAL:

- Compassion toward animals.
- Less tendency to violent passions.
- Less irritability, as meat contains stimulants.
- Moral sensibility is not weakened.
- Less expense and more people can be fed.
- Avoid homosexual tendencies, which is partly due to foods with feminine hormones.
- More sympathy towards others.

SPIRITUAL:

- Fewer risks of weakening the fine sensibilities of our mind.
- Temperance and self-control.
- Greater spirituality.
- Creatures made by God are not killed to satisfy our appetite.
- No danger of consuming animal blood, which is prohibited by God.
- We glorify and praise God when taking care of our body.
- We return to the original diet, thus fulfilling God's plan for our time.

27 SEVEN KEYS TO A HEALTHY LIFE



God wants us to be healthy and live happily. 3 John 2.

- Our happiness is closely related to our health.
- We should take care of our body, because God considers it His temple. 1 Corinthians 6:19, 20.
- God wishes to give us wisdom so we can avoid illness or recover our health.

1. The Bible says that our body is the temple of the Holy Spirit. What will God do to those who deliberately defile it? 1 Corinthians 3:16, 17.

As we consider our great responsibility in caring for our bodies, let us take into account seven important points.

Seven Keys to a Healthy Life:

- **One:** Use water internally and externally. Doctors recommend six to eight glasses of water a day, drunk between meals, to detoxify the system. Showering daily is also very advantageous, as it stimulates the elimination of toxins through the pores, thus contributing to excellent physical health.
- **Two:** Rest sufficiently. We should sleep at least 8 hours a day (though children need more) because it strengthens the nervous system. Furthermore, a weekly rest day, such as the Sabbath, is a blessing both for the body and the soul.
- **Three:** Implement regular habits. Keep a fixed eating schedule. Eating between meals overloads the stomach. When we finish eating, we should rest the stomach for about four to six hours, without ingesting anything else but liquids.
- **Four:** Practice temperance. One should be temperate when eating, at work and in all activities: sexual, intellectual, etc. Even the healthiest food, if taken in excess can be detrimental to our health. We should leave the table feeling that we could have eaten more. Digestion starts in the mouth, so chew your food well. Temperance means balance. We should not to eat just because we like something but also because it is good for us.
- **Five:** Consume natural foods. We will expand below:

2. What kind of food was man given when he was created in Eden? Genesis 1:29.

Fruits, plant yielding seeds, and cereals were foods given to man in the beginning.

3. When was man allowed to eat certain kinds of meat, called clean meats? Genesis 7:2; 9:3, 4.

Before the flood, about 1,500 years after creation, God's people did not eat meat. There were people who lived up to 500 years; but when meat was permitted in man's diet, longevity immediately diminished.

Although man was allowed to eat meat after the flood, he was never allowed to eat blood, fat or unclean animals. He could only eat the kinds of animals mentioned in Leviticus 11 and Deuteronomy 14.

3. All the prophecies he proclaims come true (Deuteronomy 18:22).
4. He does not incite apostasy or separation from the will of God (Deuteronomy 13:1-4).
5. He acknowledges Christ's incarnation (1 John 4:1-3).
6. His messages are straightforward. He does not flatter; on the contrary, he points out the people's sins (Isaiah 58:1), and God's imminent judgment (Revelation 14:6, 7).
7. His messages are important, not trivial. He contributes to the spiritual growth of the church and gives advice on religious matters (2 Corinthians 13:2, 3).
8. His teachings and his life will have Christ at their core (2 Corinthians 10:5).
9. He will prophesy in the Lord's name and he will never give his own interpretation (2 Peter 1:20, 21).
10. We should look at how he receives the visions and his relationship to the people of his time (Daniel 10:8).

In 1844, when according to prophecy the truth that had been trodden underfoot would be restored, God sent a message to his people through the Spirit of Prophecy. Ellen Harmon, later Ellen G. White, a feeble 17-year-old young woman, was a precious instrument in God's hands. She fulfilled all ten characteristics previously mentioned. Those who have read her writings see that they work for the improvement and spiritual growth of the church and promote unity of faith. In spite of her limited education, she wrote about 100,000 pages published in more than 50 books which are in circulation today, along with hundreds of pamphlets, and about 4000 articles for several magazines. Religious scholars acknowledge that her writings are inspired. She received revelations, wrote, and preached to millions of people from 1844 to 1915, which is more than 70 years. Many people testify that she led an exemplary life. At every moment, she exalted Jesus Christ as primary and presented Him in the most wonderful way; she also lifted up the holy law of God. Her prophecies were all accurately fulfilled, including the First World War, the destruction of ships and large buildings, and fires that no one was able to put out; the destruction of San Francisco and Oakland (California) in the 1906 earthquake; the increase of spiritualism and the union of Catholics and Protestants; without having any formal education in astronomy, she gave accurate astronomical data, and she also gave scientific information about health, such as prenatal influences. Furthermore, the origin of cancer, nutrition, etc. In her many writings, there is no contradiction with the Bible. Her writings are like a microscope; they do not contradict but amplify details. They are also like a telescope that does not recreate new stars but shows the beauty of the ones that exist. A few of her books are: Steps to Christ (published in more than 100 languages), The Great Controversy, The Desire of Ages, The Ministry of Healing, Patriarchs and Prophets, Prophets and Kings, Child Guidance, Testimony Treasures, etc. The central point of Ellen White's message was Christ's life - His incarnation, ministry, death, resurrection and present work on behalf of sinners in the heavenly sanctuary. The best glimpses into the life of Jesus Christ ever written are found in her books: Steps to Christ and The Desire of Ages, among other, whose reading we advise.

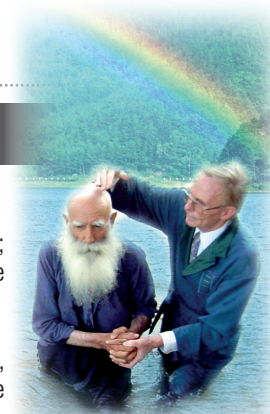

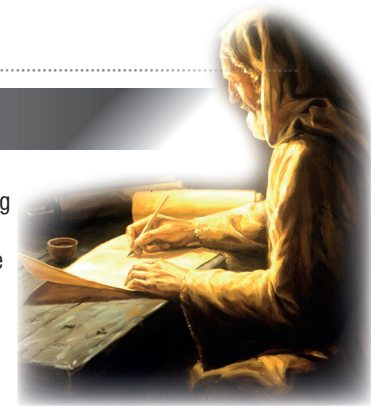
CONCLUSION

26 HOW IDENTIFY A TRUE PROPHET



One day we may have to face the question that Paul addressed to King Agrippa: “Believest thou the prophets? I know that thou believest” (Acts 26:27). However, we are usually skeptical of a person who claims to have a message from God. How can we differentiate between true and false? Throughout time, God has guided His people through messengers. Does the Bible suggest the existence of prophets in our day?

GOD COMMUNICATES WITH MAN

1. In the beginning, God communicated with man face to face, but sin separated him from God (Isaiah 59:2). Christ bridged the gap between man and God. **What means did God provide to reveal His mysteries to men? Amos 3:7.** _____

The prophets spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit (2 Peter 1:21).

2. **Is being a prophet by human designation, by inheritance, or does it come directly from God? Ephesians 4:8, 11.** _____

3. **What is a prophet?**

The word prophet comes from two Hebrew words: roeh, which means to see; that is why a prophet is also called a seer (1 Samuel 9:9), and the word nabi, which means to declare. Therefore, a prophet sees and declares what God shows him and then he writes down the message (Daniel 7:1). He tells of future events, according to the revelation and will of God.

4. **How does God transmit His messages to the prophets? Numbers 12:6-8.**

_____ to _____: *this method was used only with Moses*

In _____: with his eyes opened, but without breathing, the prophet sees in a panoramic view what God shows him concerning the past, present or future, as well as events in the invisible world.

Through prophetic dreams: this method should not be confused with common dreams, which are a product of the mind’s automatic, natural subconscious (Ecclesiastes 5:7). Prophets existed in both the New and Old Testament times. Many misinterpret the text in Matthew 11:13 and think that after John the Baptist there would be no more prophets. However, we can see that there were other prophets after John: Agabus (Acts 21:10), Anna (Luke 2:36), Simon (Acts 13:1), and more. Paul, Peter and Judas also prophesied.
